*RESIDENCE HALL BREAK SCHEDULE

Residence Halls will close for the Thanksgiving and Winter Breaks. Halls close on Tuesday, November 21 at 7 p.m. for the Thanksgiving break and Friday, December 15 at 7 p.m. for the Winter break. If your student has a need to stay on campus past these dates, they should submit a break housing request through <u>eRezLife</u>. The Thanksgiving Break housing request is currently available, and the Winter Break request will be available after Thanksgiving.

***THANKSGIVING BREAK SHUTTLE INFORMATION**

The 2023 Thanksgiving Break shuttle sign-up is now available. The shuttles will be available on Monday, November 20th and Tuesday, November 21st. Capacity is limited and on a first come, first serve basis. The Transportation Office will be running shuttles to:

- TF Green Airport
- Amtrak/MBTA Station in downtown Providence
- Peter Pan Bus Terminal (1 Peter Pan Way, Providence, RI 02904)

The Airport shuttle will run every 60 minutes from 8:00am – 3:00pm while the Amtrak/Peter Pan Bus shuttles will run every 30 minutes from 8:00am – 4:00pm. To sign up and reserve a spot for the shuttle, students will need to <u>please click this link</u> and fill out the form. When selecting departure time on the form, that is the time the shuttle will be leaving campus and NOT the time of the student's actual Flight/Train/Bus departure time.

- Students will receive an email from the Transportation Office approximately 3 5 days after a request has been submitted, to confirm their reservation. If a student doesn't receive a confirmation email, then the request is not approved.
- Students are allowed to bring <u>one suitcase and backpack on the shuttle</u>. If students bring additional suitcases, they will not be permitted to ride the shuttle and will need to find another method of transportation. minutes before your scheduled reservation.

***THE CENTER FOR GLOBAL EDUCATION (CGE)**

The CGE Team looks forward to supporting your student's study abroad experience. The email below was recently sent to 2024-25 study abroad applicants.

Dear Study Abroad Applicant,

The Center for Global Education (CGE) is happy that you are working on your study abroad application for next academic year, 2024-25. Please make sure that your application is complete by **December 1** as late applications will not be accepted.

Fall/Spring Semester Balance

Providence College is very proud of its study abroad tradition, and the institution's participation rates in study abroad have received national recognition. In recent years, demand for fall semester study abroad has far exceeded demand for the spring semester. Thus far, it appears this trend will apply to the next academic year.

While the college wants to support any student who wishes to study abroad, we may need to take steps after reviewing applications to better balance the number of students studying abroad in the fall and spring semesters. There are several reasons for this. The most important of which relate to housing constraints, course scheduling, and class enrollments – all essential components of PC's operations.

To balance enrollments between the fall and spring semester for the 2023-24 academic year, CGE conducted a lottery for the fall semester and reassigned some fall semester applicants to the spring semester in order to balance enrollments. If necessary, CGE will engage in the same process for next year. Throughout this semester, CGE staff have been advising prospective study abroad students to be flexible with their study abroad plans for next year, and that we cannot guarantee either fall or spring semester. More information will be shared with study abroad applicants after CGE reviews applications, and this will likely be in mid to late January.

Payment Policy:
