*RESIDENCE LIFE - EASTER AND END -OF -YEAR CLOSING

Please remember residence halls close on the following dates:

Easter Break - Wednesday, March 27th and reopen on Monday, April 1^{st.}

End of year - May 10th at 7pm for non-graduating students. Students must be fully moved out by that time or have an approved reason to remain on campus. Graduates have until May 20 at noon to move out.

*EASTER BREAK SHUTTLE SERVICE

The Transportation Office will be running shuttles on Wednesday, March 27th to:

- TF Green Airport running every 60 minutes from 8:00am-3:00pm
- Amtrak/MBTA Station in downtown Providence running every 30 minutes from 8:00am-4:00pm
- Peter Pan Bus Terminal (1 Peter Pan Way, Providence, RI 02904) running every 30 minutes from 8:00am-4:00pm

<u>Students should check their email for a link to the sign-up form and instructions.</u> Capacity is limited and is on a first come, first serve basis.

Students are allowed to bring **one suitcase and backpack on the shuttle**. If students bring additional suitcases, they will not be permitted to ride the shuttle and will need to find another method of transportation. The shuttle will pick students up at the backside of Raymond Hall on Donnelly Drive, across from the Raymond Lot. Students must arrive 15 minutes before their scheduled reservation.

*RESIDENCE LIFE – HOUSING APPLICATIONS

The housing application for the 2024-2025 academic year launches on March 21st and must be completed by April 2nd. Housing deposits are no longer required for returning students. Housing Selection can be a stressful time for some students, but please remind your student that residence life staff is available to assist them throughout the process. For more information, students can attend a Housing Information Session or one of our drop-in office hours.

The housing selection process will be conducted by class year on the following dates: Class of 2025 on April 4th, Class of 2026 on April 9th, and Class of 2027 on April 23rd. *THE STUDENT SUCCESS CENTER

<u>Fall Advising and Registration</u>: The fall advising period has begun! Students have received multiple emails from the Office of the Registrar, the Student Success Center, and their major department/program regarding the registration dates and a detailed explanation of the advising and registration process. In addition to information on the registration dates and processes, students have access to the <u>Academic Advising Resource</u> page, which summarizes much of this information. Please encourage your students to review those emails, explore the Academic Advising resource page, and connect with their advisor to discuss their Fall course options before registration. Beyond Fall advising and registration, if your student is experiencing difficulties in one of their courses and wants to explore the <u>course withdrawal option</u>, the deadline for a course withdrawal is April 26th.

<u>Summer Course Options:</u> While summer courses are not required, some students look to take a course during the summer. If your student is considering taking a summer course, here is more information on <u>PC's summer offerings</u> and the ability to <u>take courses at an outside college or university</u>. Students can speak with their academic advisor or an advisor in the Student Success Center (2nd floor of the library) if they have questions about summer courses.

*CENTER FOR GLOBAL EDUCATION/STUDY ABROAD

Special Announcement for the Class of 2027: <u>CIV in London</u> Spring 2025 – <u>Applications</u> due on March 31

Providence College is proud to offer this special study abroad opportunity to second semester sophomore students for them to complete their DWC requirement in the historically rich and global city of London. Prof. Christopher Arroyo (Philosophy) and Prof. Eric Bennett (English) are the faculty directors for the spring 2025 iteration of the program. Students will take DWC 202 and at least one additional course with the faculty directors, which will fulfill PC Core Curriculum requirements – Ethics and Fine Arts.

In addition to the above courses, students will round out their course schedule with courses at the IES Abroad London Study Center along with the possibility of enrolling in a course at a local university. The program will also include numerous site visits in London along with excursions further afield in the UK and Europe.

Payment Policy:

Outstanding indebtedness to the College will result in a financial hold being placed on a student's account. This prevents a student from registering, or receiving a degree, grade reports, transcript, or letter of recommendation. Seniors with outstanding indebtedness will be unable to receive a cap & gown and participate in Commencement activities.
