*RESIDENCE LIFE – SPRING 2025 MOVE-OUT & SUMMER STORAGE

For non-graduating students, the residence halls will close on Friday, May 9th at 7pm. Students should be completely out of their residence halls within 24 hours after their last final exam or this time (whichever comes first). Graduating students need to be completely moved out of their residence halls or College-owned houses by Monday, May 19th at 12 p.m.

UPS staff will be on campus during Finals Week to help put students' items in storage for the summer or ship items home. *STUDENT HEALTH CENTER -IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS DUE BY MAY 1st

Classes of 2027 & 2028: Unfortunately, there are still a number of students in the Class of 2028 and the Class of 2027 who have not submitted their <u>college required health forms</u>. To avoid disciplinary action, please be sure your student has logged onto the <u>Patient Portal</u> and read all

messages from The Student Health Center, has completed their health history, answered the TB questionnaire, and uploaded documentation of all immunizations as required by the Rhode Island Department of Health **prior to May 1, 2025**. Students and families with questions about their status should log into the Health Center Patient Portal – (<u>Patient Portal login here</u>) using their Providence College network ID and password.

Class of 2026: Students from the Class of 2026 who still have outstanding immunization documentation are required to submit a paper copy of their immunizations as required by the Rhode Island Department of Health to the Providence College Student Health Center (mail to Student Health Center, Davis Hall, 1 Cunningham Sq, Providence RI 02918) no later than May 1, 2025. Students with missing immunization records have been notified via email from the Student Health Center. *FINANCIAL AID

The Office of Financial Aid is extending the deadline for students applying for need-based aid to May 5, 2025. Any <u>FAFSA</u> and <u>CSS Profile</u> applications received after this date may be considered late. To upload any additional documents, create a <u>Student Forms</u> account in your <u>TORCH</u> <u>Portal</u>. You will receive notifications by text and email about any missing items and when your application is complete.

*2025-2026 PARKING LOTTERY

Providence College holds an annual parking lottery that is only open to rising juniors and seniors. Space is limited and we only have a certain number of designated parking spots for juniors and seniors **who live on campus**. The lottery will be open from May 6th, 2025, to July 4th, 2025. If your student is a lottery winner, they must have their vehicle in the <u>ARMS Parking Application</u> (Safari not supported) AND pay the permit fee in <u>CashNet</u> by August 1, 2025, otherwise their permit will be forfeited and provided to the next student in line. We will <u>NOT</u> accept any applications after the July 4th, 2025, deadline.

Students will receive an email detailing the application process, as well as a reminder the day before the lottery form opens. The lottery form will also be available on the Transportation & Parking Website (site requires login).
