Cap and gown ordering closes in one week!

Remind your students to order their cap and gown as the deadline of March 5, 2025 is fast approaching. Emails with information regarding Cap and Gown Day, scheduled for April 9, 2025, and ordering information have been sent to all members of the class of 2025, since the fall semester. Undergraduates in the class of 2025 will continue to receive emails with information regarding Commencement activities and important details for graduates.

*2025-2026 HOUSING SELECTION INFORMATION

Housing Selection for the 2025-2026 academic year is underway. All members of the Class of 2028 and most members of the Class of 2027 (unless they have been approved by the Office of Residence Life to live off campus) are required to live on campus unless commuting from the home of a parent or guardian. We have enough housing for all undergraduate students who are required and/or desire to live on campus. Students can now begin forming roommate groups on their eRezLife account. Housing selection dates are as follows.

- Class of 2026: Monday, March 3rd
- Class of 2027: Wednesday, March 5th
- Class of 2028: Wednesday, March 26th (apartments, McCarthy/Suites, Shanley/semi-suites) & Monday, April 14th (traditional hall triples) *

*Approximately 35% of the Class of 2028 will live in traditional halls next year (Guzman & St. Joseph Hall). We recognize the demand for apartment, suite, and semi-suite housing among the rising sophomore class surpasses the inventory. All students who have complete groups (i.e., 4 students for a 4-person Shanley semi-suite or 4 students for a 4-person apartment) are

encouraged to try for their first housing choice on Wednesday, March 26. However, please recognize that at a certain point in the day the inventory of apartments/suites/semi-suites will run out and students will be notified there are none of these options left. Students will then be able to pick a traditional hall room on April 14th. The 2½ week timeline between Class of 2028 selection dates is purposely designed to give students the time to come up with a new housing plan if they are not able to select an apartment, suite, or semi-suite. An example of a new housing plan could be three groups of four students who did not receive housing in Shanley on March 26th joining together to form four triples and selecting housing on the same residence hall floor on April 14th.

*RESIDENCE HALL CLOSING SCHEDULE

Please keep in mind the following residence hall closing schedules:

- Spring Break: Residence halls close Friday, March 7th at 7 p.m. and do not reopen until Sunday, March 16th at 12 p.m.
- Easter Break: Residence halls close Wednesday, April 16 at 7 p.m. and do not reopen until Monday, April 21st at 12 p.m.
- End of Semester: Residence halls close Friday, May 9 at 7 p.m. for non-graduating students and Monday, May 19 at 12 p.m. for graduating students

We encourage all students to create their <u>Student Forms</u> account through the <u>TORCH Portal</u>. Once they set up their account, students will receive text and email updates whenever we request documentation, and they can submit it directly through the portal.
