*RESIDENCE HALLS CLOSINGS

Residence halls close for Thanksgiving Break on Tuesday, November 26, 2024, at 7pm and will reopen on Sunday, December 1, 2024, at 12pm. If your student needs to request to stay later or come back early, they should submit a Thanksgiving Break Housing request on the eRezLife site. It is the responsibility of each resident to plan their own travel in accordance with this schedule.

Residence halls will close for the winter break on Friday, December 20, 2024, at 7pm and will reopen on Sunday, January 12, 2025, at 12pm. A break housing application will be available after Thanksgiving Break.

*THANKSGIVING BREAK SHUTTLE INFORMATION

Sign-ups are now available for the 2024 Thanksgiving Break shuttle sign-up. Capacity is limited, and reservations will be approved on a first come, first serve basis. The shuttles will be available on Monday, November 25th and Tuesday, November 26th to TF Green Airport; the Amtrak/MBTA Station in downtown Providence; and the Peter Pan Bus Terminal (1 Peter Pan Way, Providence, RI 02904). The Airport shuttle will run every 60 minutes from 8:00am-3:00pm. The Amtrack/Peter Pan Bus shuttles will run every 30 minutes from 8:00am-4:00pm.

To sign up and reserve a spot, students must complete <u>this form</u>. Students will receive an email from the Transportation Office to confirm or deny their request.

*CLASS OF 2027 OFF CAMPUS HOUSING APPLICATIONS

Providence College has a three-year residency requirement, and all students should have the expectation to live on campus through the end of their junior year unless they are commuting from the home of a parent or guardian. This coming year the College has decided to make limited exceptions and allow a small number of Class of 2027 students to live off campus for their junior year. Members of the Class of 2027 must apply and be approved to live off campus for the 2025-2026 academic year. More information is available on our website. *THE OFFICE OF FINANCIAL AID

The 2025-2026 CSS Profile is open and FAFSA is still delayed until December. You will use information from your 2023 taxes on both of these applications. Returning students must complete these applications no later than April 15th. We will make sure to update our Facebook (pcfinaid) and Instagram (@provcollegefinaid) pages with important announcements especially related to the release of the 2025-2026 FAFSA. Please also encourage your student to create their <u>Student Forms</u> account through the <u>TORCH Portal</u>. Below are instructions on how they can create their student forms account:

- 1. Go to https://providence.studentforms.com/
- 2. Click 'Create Account' link
- 3. Confirm your student information
- 4. Click 'Create Account' button

Once they create an account, students will receive text and email updates when we request any documentation and can submit directly through this portal!

*SPRING ADVISING AND REGISTRATION

Students recently received emails regarding the registration dates and a detailed explanation of the advising and registration process. These emails were sent the week of October 14th titled "Spring 2025 Advising and Registration Information." In addition to information on the registration dates and processes, they also included a helpful resource for students, the Spring 2025 Advising and Registration page. Please encourage your students to review those emails, explore the Academic Advising resources, and connect with their advisor to discuss their Spring course options well in advance of the registration period.

Beyond Spring advising and registration, if your student is experiencing difficulties in one of their courses and wants to explore the <u>course withdrawal option</u>, the deadline for a course withdrawal is December 6th. As always, we recommend that your student speak to their instructor before considering the course withdrawal option. Study Abroad application deadline for academic year 2025-26: December 1, 2024As part of the application process, study abroad applicants are required to attend a Study Abroad 101 session. The <u>schedule</u> is available on the CGE website. Please note that late applications will not be accepted.

Study Abroad Semester Balance: Study abroad applicants for academic year 2025-26 will need to be as flexible as possible with their study abroad plans as PC cannot guarantee enrollment in a student's desired semester to study abroad. The Administration has charged the Center for Global Education with balancing study abroad enrollments between the fall and spring semester to ensure smooth operations on campus especially in terms of housing and course offerings.

Passport Day is a fast and convenient way to get a brand-new passport or renew an old passport for study abroad or even personal travel.
